## Academic Freedom: Why and how must it be defended?

Academic freedom provides the right to pursue and disseminate matters of scholarly inquiry,
pedagogy and curriculum without interference from non-academic administrative or governmental
bodies. As such it provides an important check and balance against excesses of these entities.
Academic freedom is defended through the tenure system, shared governance, as well as due
process rights supported by unions such as the PSA.
